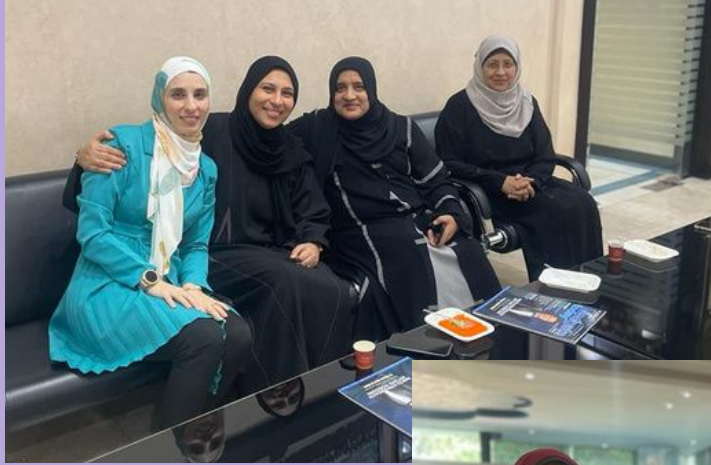

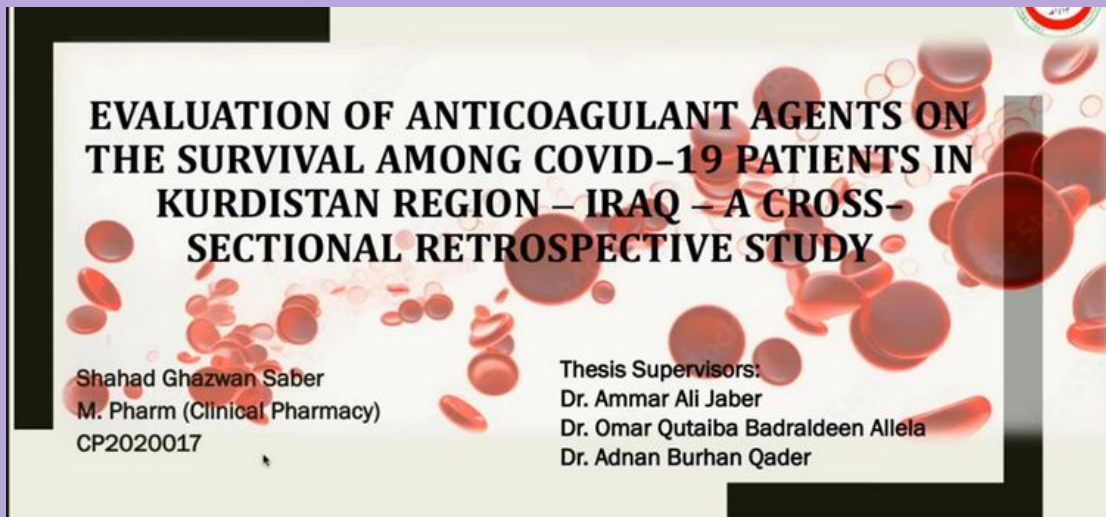

WHAT IS BREAST CANCER?

Breast cancer is a disease in which abnormal breast cells grow out of control and form tumors in the breast. If the tumour is not treated it can spread to lymph nodes and other parts of the body. Breast cancer cells begin inside the milk ducts and can make producing milk of the breast.

BREAST CANCER SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS

Changes in the size, shape, or color of the breast
 A lump or thickening in the breast
 Swelling of the breast
 Pain in the breast
 Nipple changes (redness, scaling, crusting, or discharge)
 Changes in the shape of the breast
 Changes in the color of the nipple or areola

Breast Cancer Risks What You Can and Cannot Control

What you can't prevent: Age, Family history, Genetic mutations, Race/ethnicity, Menstrual history, Reproductive history, Breast density, Hormonal therapy, Radiation therapy.

What you can prevent: Maintain a healthy weight, Exercise regularly, Limit alcohol consumption, Avoid hormone therapy, Breastfeeding, Quitting smoking, Limiting use of oral contraceptives, Limiting use of hormone replacement therapy.

These signs for women with breast cancer can help detect cancer from returning:

- Changes in the size, shape, or color of the breast
- A lump or thickening in the breast
- Swelling of the breast
- Pain in the breast
- Nipple changes (redness, scaling, crusting, or discharge)
- Changes in the shape of the breast
- Changes in the color of the nipple or areola

OCTOBER 1-31 BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

Combined with breast cancer is the most frequent, diagnosed, never-ending, life-threatening disease.

EARLY DETECTION SAVES LIVES

Breast cancer is a prevalent and serious health concern affecting women worldwide. It is estimated that 1 out of every 8 women will confront the development of breast cancer at some point in their life. (2)

TESTING AT HOME

Early detection is key to successful treatment. Use at-home breast cancer tests to detect changes in your breast tissue before they become visible to the naked eye.

SCREENING

Regular screening can help detect breast cancer early, when it's most treatable. Screening methods include mammograms, breast self-exams, and clinical breast exams.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

Know your family history, Know your body, Know your breasts, Know your doctor, Know your options.

BREAST CANCER AWARENESS

INFLUENCE OF HORMONAL REPLACEMENT THERAPY (HRT) ON INCIDENCE OF BREAST CANCER

Hormonal Replacement Therapy (HRT) is beneficial for controlling menopausal symptoms. One critical aspect of HRT lies in its connection to an increased risk of breast cancer. There is a complex relationship between HRT and breast cancer risk. This relationship requires careful consideration when women are contemplating HRT as a treatment option.

APPLICATIONS: Menopausal Symptoms Relief, Osteoporosis Prevention, Hormone Deficiency Treatment, Fertility Treatment, Cancer Treatment, Individualized Appropriate Prevention.

CONCLUSION: HRT offers significant relief from menopausal symptoms but presents a complex relationship with breast cancer risk. Women considering HRT should consult with their healthcare provider to weigh the benefits and risks based on their individual health profile.

Let's talk about TYPES OF MASTECTOMIES

Nipple-sparing mastectomy

- Removes all breast tissue while leaving the nipple intact, if possible.
- Those undergoing the nipple or areola may need to be removed if cancer is present.
- Typically an option for early-stage breast cancer with a small tumor.
- Scarring and healing in the nipple may be less.
- Individuals with tumors near or affecting the areola or nipple. Inflammatory breast cancer, scars from previous surgeries around the nipple, or history of radiation to the breast, or also smaller may not be suitable for nipple-sparing mastectomy that is reduced chances of healthy tissue in the breast skin and nipple.

Total mastectomy

- Removes all breast tissue, including the nipple and areola.
- Nipple and areola are not typically removed.
- No chest muscles or tissue beneath the breast are removed.
- Can be performed as a preventive measure for high-risk individuals.
- During cancer staging, a surgeon will perform a sentinel lymph node dissection to determine if the cancer has spread to the lymph nodes. Lymphatic mapping is used to help locate the sentinel nodes by injecting a blue dye, radioactive liquid, or both under the nipple or above the tumor site.

Modified radical mastectomy

- Removes all breast tissue and several lymph nodes under the arm.
- Lymph nodes are tested for cancer spread.
- No muscles below the breast are removed.
- Commonly used for invasive breast cancer or higher-stage cancers.
- To determine if cancer has spread to lymph nodes under the arm, a surgeon may conduct an axillary lymph node dissection and remove several lymph nodes under the skin.

Partial mastectomy

- Removes the cancerous part of the breast tissue and some healthy tissue around the tumor.
- Does not remove all breast tissue.
- Suitable for early-stage cancer that has not spread beyond the original site.
- Breast tissue is removed compared to a lumpectomy.

Radical mastectomy

- Removes all breast tissue, all lymph nodes under the arm and around the breast, and chest wall muscles below the breast.
- Lymph nodes may be tested for the presence of modified radical mastectomy.
- More extensive surgery with longer recovery time.

Immunotherapy	Systemic	Boosts immune system	Fatigue, flu-like symptoms
Radiation Therapy	Local	Kills cancer cells	Skin irritation, hair loss
Surgery	Local	Removes cancer	Pain, scarring

PREVENTION

THE BEST TIME TO CHECK YOUR BREASTS IS ABOUT A WEEK AFTER YOUR PERIOD. IT'S IMPORTANT TO CHECK AT THE SAME TIME EVERY MONTH.

- LOOK DOWN ON YOUR BARE WITH YOUR HAND BEHIND YOUR HEAD. USE THE PADS OF YOUR THUMB AND INDEX FINGER TO FEEL YOUR OPPOSITE HAND TO EXAMINE EACH BREAST.
- MOVE YOUR THUMB FINGER IN CIRCLES. CHECK BOTH CIRCLES ON ONE SPOT. STRAIGHTEN UP. LIGHT PRESSURE. THEN MEDIUM AND LASTLY HEAVY PRESSURE.
- THEN WALK YOUR FINGER TO THE NEXT AREA. DO NOT LET YOUR FINGER OFF YOUR BREAST.
- STARTING AT YOUR BREAST BONE, WORK YOUR WAY DOWN YOUR BREAST AND BACK UP. MOVE YOUR CIRCLES SPREAD EXTRA. THE CHECKING AROUND AREOLAS.
- IDENTIFY SOFTENED LUMPY AREAS AND LOOK FOR DISCHARGE OR PAIN.

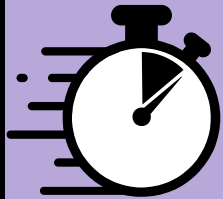

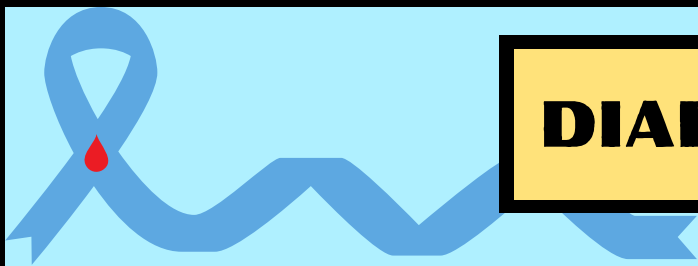


FLAG DAY

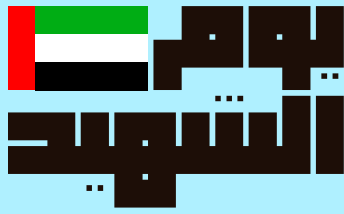
THE DUBAI FITNESS CHALLENGE

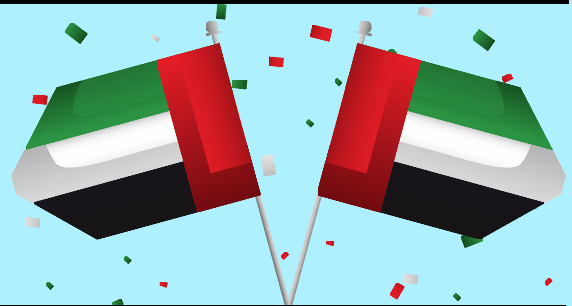

You can help prevent antibiotic resistance by taking antibiotics only when you really need them and when they are recommended by a healthcare professional.

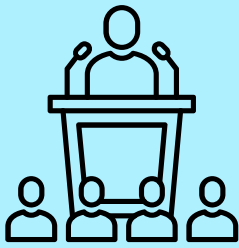
UAE NATIONAL DAY
